

Revelation Week 6 September 22 | Weekly Devotionals

## **OPEN** with prayer.

Begin this devotional exercise by finding a quiet place where you can spend time with God in his word. Before reading, pray that the Holy Spirit would open your eyes and heart to what God wants to say to you.

## **READ Revelation 5:1-14.**

- What do you learn about the scroll and its seven seals in Revelation 5:1-5? Why do you think John weeps over no one being able to open it? What do you think it contains? Who alone is able to open it and what qualifies him as such?
- How does John describe the Lamb in Revelation 5:6? List out everything you see. What do
  you think it means that the Lion is actually a Lamb? And that he's a lamb "looking as if it
  had been slain?"
- Read Revelation 5:9. What are the things that are specified here that qualify the Lamb as being able to open the scroll? To whom is all of this referring to?
- What is the effect of the Lamb's work in Revelation 5:10 for christians?
